➤ This region was selected due to its high exposure to disasters and alignment with its National Societies' (NS) programmatic work and capacity.

Objectives

Increased resilience of vulnerable populations in the Caribbean, inclusive of women, men, girls and boys, to reduce impact of disasters and crisis.

- 1. Increased capacity of selected communities in gender-sensitive Disaster Preparedness and CCA
- 2. Increased collaboration between selected communities, National Disaster Organizations and NS
- 3. Improved Disaster Risk Management (DRM) capacity of Caribbean NS that integrates gender equality and climate change adaptation
- 4. Strengthened engagement between regional actors on DRM
